Terms & Conditions for the Competition.

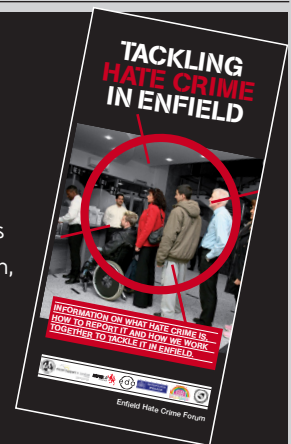
The terms & conditions listed below apply to all entries into the Enfield Hate Crime Forum - Schools Poster Competition 4.

- Prizes will be awarded at a ceremony in December 2011 and winners will be notified in November / December 2011.
- The number of entries per person and per school is unlimited.
- Entrants must be aged 4-12. Entries will only be accepted from pupils who study, live in or are home schooled in Enfield.
- Only designs received at:
Hate Crime Co-ordinator, Community Safety Unit, Po Box 50, Civic Centre, Silver Street, Enfield EN1 3XA, by 31st October 2011 will be entered into the competition.
- Each entry must be submitted along with the entrant's name, age, school address* and academic year clearly written on a piece of paper with the original artwork**. - *College or home school addresses also acceptable.
- ** If designed on a computer the digital copy on a CD ROM or printed copy will also be acceptable.
- By entering the Enfield Hate Crime Forum's Schools Competition 4, you agree that, if you win, are a runnerup, or are short-listed, your name and photograph may be used in any press or publicity (including on the Enfield Council's website) by the Enfield Hate Crime Forum.
- By entering, you also agree that, your name and your logo/poster/article can be used in publicity materials produced by the Enfield Hate Crime Forum.
- Competition entries cannot be returned.
- The judges' decision is final.
- Please familiarise yourself with these Terms & Conditions because, by entering, it is assumed you agree to abide by the rules.

Hate Crime

The term "hate crime" generally refers to an attack on a person or their property (this could mean: name calling, bullying, vandalism, assault, murder) in which the victim is intentionally selected because of their skin colour, religion, nationality, disability or sexual orientation. Each one of these crimes has a ripple effect in our communities. The pain and injustice of such crimes has a wider impact on more than just the person it has been targeted at, creating fear and tensions that ultimately affect us all.

It is very important to report every single incident of hate crime however small you may think it is. You can report an incident at your school or to any of the forums partner agencies or directly on 020 8379 4612.
